ATLANTA, GA - - (Businesswire – January 18, 2012) – – Holzer Holzer & Fistel, LLC, an Atlanta, Georgia based law firm, announces that it is investigating potential breaches of fiduciary duty by certain directors of Georgia Gulf Corporation (“Georgia Gulf” or the “Company”) (NASDAQ: GGC) in connection with the Company’s rejection of Westlake Chemical Corporation’s unsolicited offer to purchase all outstanding shares of Georgia Gulf for \$30 per share. On January 17, 2012, Westlake Chemical accused Georgia Gulf’s Board of Directors of failing to consider the offer in good faith and, instead, adopting a “poison pill” to further entrench its current members.

Holzer Holzer & Fistel, LLC’s investigation seeks to determine if Georgia Gulf’s Board has complied with its fiduciary duty to act in its shareholders best interest in responding to Westlake Chemical’s offer.
